### THE COVENANT PROJECT CONTINUES AT THE CENTER FOR THE STUDY OF FEDERALISM

As reported in earlier issues of the Notebook, the Center for the Study of Pederalism is involved in a series of research projects and workshops on the "Covenant as a Political Concept and Factor Influencing Political Behavior." The entire series is a multidistplinary effort to outline the fullest meaning of the covenant idea in political philosophy, to examine the current and historical importance and consequences of the idea, to document the complex ways in which it has been operationalized in several polities, and, most broadly, to further our understanding of how ideas, culture, and institutions shape political behavior.

The covenant concept embodies the idea of human relationships founded upon morally informed partnerships of independent people or peoples who freely join and undertake shared endeavors with a promise of mutual obligation for the common good and mutual respect for the integrity of each other. Politically, it expresses the idea that people build communities and establish civil relationships upon such covenants or compacts, whether religious or secular. The covenant concept is of especial interest to students of federalism. Federalism, from the latin foedus meaning covenant, is rooted in the covenantal tradition stemming from ancient Israel. As such, federal and covenantal Ideas have been important in the Jewish political tradition, the church polities of the reformed wing of Protestantism, and the secular polities influenced by that wing, particularly in the cases of Switzerland, the United States, and the Wetherlands. From their earliest beginnings, the people and polities comprising the United States bound themselves together through covenants to erect their New World order, deliberately following biblical precedents in the process.

Over the last two years several workshops on the covenant idea have been held in Philadelphia. Most recently papers were given by Daniel J. Blazar on "The Covenant Idea and Politics"; Vincent Ostrom on "Contracts, Choice, and Civil Disobedience"; Douglas Sturm on

"Contracts, Constitutions, and Covenants"; and John Kincaid on "Covenant as a Mode of Political Community." Out of these workshops a number of research ideas have been proposed and undertaken by various affiliated scholars. Included among these topics are: the relationships and distinctions between covenants, compacts, and contracts and their roles in politics and philosophy; the covenantal and natural law traditions; covenantal ideas in the political traditions of the Jews, Swiss, Dutch, Scots, Americans, and Afrikaners as well as the church polities of reformed Protestantism; the federal or covenant theology of the Puritans; the secularization of the covenant idea in the sixteenth century; covenants and civil religion; town covenants in the United States; and the covenant idea in American literature. Additional research on these and related topics is being conducted at cooperating centers in Israel and Switzerland.

The next American workshop on the covenant idea will be held in Philadelphia in February 1979. Scholars interested in attending that workshop or obtaining additional information on this project should contact John Rincaid, the project's coordinator, at the Center for the Study of Federalism.
